Third-round tournament quotes

AN INTERVIEW WITH ANGELA PARK

PAM WARNER: We are joined by Angela Park. Angela, another 69 today, two shots behind.... Actually, I think just one shot now, behind Lorena. Just talk about your day and your thoughts going into tomorrow.

ANGELA PARK: I played really solid out there today. Just like I did the last two days. The putting, I three-putted a couple of holes. I think that was just the one fault that I had today. I'm going tomorrow to try to get a good feel for the greens early in the morning. We are probably going to play around 10-ish. Just looking forward to tomorrow and posting a low score up there first and hopefully seeing that number, they're going to get nervous, and we will see what happens.

PAM WARNER: Can we go over your scorecard?

ANGELA PARK: Birdie on 3, 60-degree lob wedge to about a foot.

Bogey on four, I three-putted from like 20 feet.

Birdie on seven, 54 degree to about 15 feet.

Bogey on nine, 3-putted from like 15 feet.

Birdie on 11, from 30 feet, 6-iron.

Birdie on 12, lob wedge to about 15 feet.

And a birdie on 18, I hit a 9-iron to about 15 feet.

PAM WARNER: Questions for Angela?

Q. You are just one shot away from a couple of pretty experienced players, Lorena and Suzann, but do you feel like this could be the week you finally get that first victory?

ANGELA PARK: I feel like every week is the week that I could finally get my first victory. I don't know. Coming into this year I told myself that everything good or bad is going to be a learning experience for me, especially as a rookie. So, you know, I never put myself down. So in this situation where I am in, I'm going to take the positive. I'm only one stroke back. There is 18 more holes to go. You never know what they're going to do. They played very well today. It's kind of hard to play well again the next day, so we will see how it goes. Obviously, I'm just going to have to play my game and not focus on what they do or what they shoot.

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ANGELA PARK INTERVIEW TRANSCRIPT 10.13.07

Q. Are you kind of glad in a way that you're not in the last group so maybe a little less pressure close to Lorena?

ANGELA PARK: I think I'm a little glad because I'm sure when you play with Lorena, everyone is like 'Viva Mexico' or something. I hear them like a couple of holes behind me. It's like, 'Oh my gosh, how do you deal with it?' If it's me, there is a couple of claps, 'Angela, go Angela.' I'm glad in that kind of aspect. Being nervous, I've played with her before, but we will see how it goes.

Q. What was the problem on the green today with the three-putts? Was it the speed or were you just putting yourself in the wrong places a couple of times?

ANGELA PARK: The speed, I hit a couple passed the hole. It's only three feet coming back so I guess my three-footers were the problem. So, you know, you won't be surprised if you see me out there hitting some three-footers for about 30 minutes.

Q. Was this a really early morning for you?

ANGELA PARK: What's the question?

Q. Because the tee times were so early, was this a weird start this morning for you?

ANGELA PARK: No, because I usually tend to play better in the morning when we play regular LPGA events in the morning. And afternoon times I usually tend to play better in the morning, so I was actually excited that the tee times were early, yes.

Q. Is there anything that you've learned throughout the year how to prepare yourself for the final round when you are near the lead?

ANGELA PARK: A lot. Especially since I've been in this situation so many times, I always tell myself to be patient. There is no secret out there. Just go out there and play like I've been playing. You know, if I shoot 5-under, and they shoot a 5-under, and they win by one, what can I do then? I just try to focus on my own game, try to fix the faults that I had today, not make the same mistakes that I did today, tomorrow.
