Third-round tournament quotes

AN INTERVIEW WITH BRANDT SNEDEKER

(Interview by tape.)

Q. Let's go to 8, how much did that effect you, do you think?

BRANDT SNEDEKER: Not really. I just didn't hit that putt. I hit a good second putt. I hit it to the right and missed it.

Q. What did you hit coming back?

BRANDT SNEDEKER: Probably six or seven feet coming back. It was bad the first putt. There is no other way around it. I hit it bad.

9 was just a poor tee shot. First real bad tee shot I hit all week. Made a bogey there.

I was disappointed two 3 putts on the par-3s. Stupid bone head mistakes, but you are going to have those. You can't lose your patience. I'm disappointed with the way I finished to be where I was, and have a chance to kind of separate myself from the field and make good birdies, and I didn't do it. So learn from it, come out here tomorrow and shoot a low one.

Q. Did that just wear a player down?

BRANDT SNEDEKER: Yes, it does. I felt lucky out there because I played so good this morning. I had good momentum going. Then two bad bogeys in a row, just kind of lost the momentum. It started wearing you down. My hands got cold. It got cold out there. The greens were bumpy. You had to grind hard out there coming in and I didn't do a good job of it. I got 20 more holes tomorrow to figure it out.

Q. What is the advantage of playing those holes tomorrow?

BRANDT SNEDEKER: It's definitely good. I did not have anything

going the right way these last three holes. I hit a good tee shot on 16 which is good. The wind will play a lot easier. Fresh greens tomorrow morning. Go out there on 16, 17 and 18 and hopefully have three good looks on it. And 18, I'm glad I don't have to play that hole. I got relatively lucky.

Q. Where were you on 16, middle of the fairway?

BRANDT SNEDEKER: Left side of the fairway.

Q. At one point you are four ahead, you talked about that, and you look here and you are still --

BRANDT SNEDEKER: Yes, that's the whole positive of today. I had a chance to do something and get myself up there, and I didn't do it. I'm still right there. A couple of good holes tomorrow coming in the stretch, and I will have a chance. That's what you look forward to, have a chance on Sunday and I do.

If I can finish strong tomorrow I'll be fine.

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
