AN INTERVIEW WITH BRITTANY LANG

PAM WARNER: Brittany, thank you for coming in today and joining us.

BRITTANY LANG: You're welcome.

PAM WARNER: A little up and down round out there. You had an eagle on 17 and saved par on 18. You are one shot off the lead still.

Do you want to talk about what happened out there today?

BRITTANY LANG: Yes, I didn't really get anything going on the front 9. I hit 8 greens and was even par. I didn't make anything. And then went to the back 9. I 3-putted 9. I think I only missed 2 greens. I went to the back 9, 3-putted, so I was 1-over. Birdied 11 and 12. I had one more bogey coming in and eagle on 17. I hit a little bit better coming in.

PAM WARNER: What are your thoughts going into tomorrow being in the position you're in?

BRITTANY LANG: It's going to be fun. I have never been in this position. I'm excited. I'm just going to go out and try to play aggressively and play hard.

PAM WARNER: Scorecard.

BRITTANY LANG: Yes.

PAM WARNER: Bogey on 5.

BRITTANY LANG: Yes, I pulled a 7-iron into a bunker and had a very awkward stance, shortsided myself, and hit it out, didn't get to the green, chipped up to about 4 feet and made that putt for bogey.

PAM WARNER: Birdie on 6.

BRITTANY LANG: Yes, I hit, I think it was an 8-iron to about 25 feet and made that.

PAM WARNER: 10.

BRITTANY LANG: 10, I 3-putted 10.

PAM WARNER: How far would you say the first one?

BRITTANY LANG: That was downhill again. That was probably 30, 40 feet.

PAM WARNER: Birdie on 11.

BRITTANY LANG: I hit driver, 3-wood, lipped out for eagle and tapped in for birdie. It's just short off the green.

PAM WARNER: Birdie on 12.

BRITTANY LANG: Yes, I hit a pitching wedge in there to about four feet and made that.

PAM WARNER: Birdie on 15.

BRITTANY LANG: I hit a pitching wedge to about ten feet. Made that.

PAM WARNER: Bogey on 16.

BRITTANY LANG: I had like 80 yards and I left it short. I didn't even hit the green, I left it short.

PAM WARNER: What club?

BRITTANY LANG: Sand wedge, a little chip sand wedge, and I was right up against the collar and left that short and then missed the 9-footer for par.

PAM WARNER: Eagle on 17.

BRITTANY LANG: I hit driver and my 3-wood and made the 1-foot putt.

Yes, hit driver way right to where I had a shot, pitching wedge on. I had a putt of about 30 feet and left it three or four feet short and made that.

PAM WARNER: Questions for Brittany?

BRITTANY LANG: It's kind of like a 4-wood, it's a 17 degree wood, if that matters.

Q. So early in the week we had all of these great players here, the Hall of Famers that played, and today we go into the final round with names that Rochester golf fans aren't real familiar with, compared to those at least, is it just the state of the LPGA, this is what happens, you got a lot of players who are capable of winning and here we got four or five at the top of the leaderboard doing this, that's the way the LPGA is, so many players who could win a tournament?

BRITTANY LANG: Yes, definitely. You could miss the cut one week and make it the next. The LPGA is stacked with great players, yes.

Q. We are seeing the depth this week?

BRITTANY LANG: Yes.

Q. Tell me about the chase that's going to go on tomorrow, the numbers aren't all in yet. There is a lot of you very tight, maybe within four or five shots, is it one of those days where it's just going to be a mad dash to the finish. Basically low score is going to win tomorrow?

BRITTANY LANG: Yes, it looks like that way. The weather is supposed to be like it was these last two days which is favorable. You are going to have to post mid to high 60's to get it done. There will be a lot of birdies tomorrow.

Q. The way you played so far, you said 66 was there yesterday, and you didn't get it, 69 today, do you have one of those in you?

BRITTANY LANG: Yes, definitely. I mean sometimes for me it's hard to follow up a very good round. You need to refocus and go out and do the same thing tomorrow. I didn't do that when I shot 71, but yesterday or today on the back 9 I felt like I could have shot a low round today. It came around. It wasn't so good on the front 9, but it came around. It feels good for tomorrow.
