**AN INTERVIEW WITH JONAHAN BYRD**

(Interview by tape.)

Q. Have you ever been through a fog delay as long as there was this morning.

JONATHAN BYRD: I didn't really go through it. I woke up at 8. I was supposed to play at 11:44, and woke up and saw the fog delay and was kind of happy because I knew it was slow play during the morning, and a slow breakfast, a little warm up.

So I went and had a leisure breakfast, and they one-upped me there, and threw me an curveball, and I went earlier than I was supposed to go. So I had to kind of speed up and get ready quick and get on the range, but it was better that way than the guys that had to walk down playing 8 (Inaudible). That was tough.

Q. There is a difference playing on Sunday, I talked to a couple of guys, they don't realize what Sunday means, how different a Sunday is than say today or a Thursday, but pressure-wise they are playing on Sunday?

JONATHAN BYRD: Right. Well, I mean it's whatever pressure you put on yourself. Spectators don't. They know some difference. But there is nothing you can pinpoint on a golf course that can make it feel any different. I think we golfers put more pressure on ourself because we want to finish well because we have high expectations, and the more we can make it like a normal round the better it is.

Q. Talk about your round today, how you played?

JONATHAN BYRD: I played really solid today, no bogeys. I left a few out there, but I made a couple of good saves. Other than that, I just hit a lot of greens, played really solid. Made five birdies and 13 pars.

Q. There was a comment yesterday that probably the guys at the top wont do anything to fall back, you are going to have to catch them, do you change your game or do you have to still play?

JONATHAN BYRD: You never know what's going to happen. I have see seen Vijay shoot some 78's this year. And him shooting 78 is always uncharacteristic. So you never know what's going to happen on out there. Yes, some of these par-5s, like 16, you are trying to see if you can make a three to catch up on two shots. But, you, know the same game plan, you just got to make a bunch of putts. When somebody gets off to a good start as Vijay, you can't force it. You just have to play the golf course.
