**AN INTERVIEW WITH CRISTIE KERR**

(An interview by tape.)

CRISTIE KERR: We just misjudged the wind and I hit a horrible club on 17 yesterday. It was just a mental air more than anything else, and I got really pissed off and made whatever I made. But today is a different day apparently and I played great. I hit it great. I made a lot of putts and was able to keep the momentum going all day.

Q. You hit the second ball in the water on yesterday. It was in the muck and water?

CRISTIE KERR: Yes, it's something you don't want to remember. Today I birdied it.

Q. Was there an extra determination at that tee box today?

CRISTIE KERR: Yes, I wanted to get that hole back, frankly. A little different wind today. It was easier to judge the wind and, you know, it was my decision. It was a smart decision with taking a little less club and letting it ride the wind about 15 feet from the hole, and I made a good putt out of it.

Q. (Inaudible.)

CRISTIE KERR: Well, golf is one thing, but I've always felt like this is one of the best places. I'm a member out here. I practice out here, and I know the course better than anybody. I get to be home in South Florida.

Q. The people on the last pairing, were you amused by that yesterday?

CRISTIE KERR: I really didn't hear. I heard something about it, but I played (Inaudible). I didn't really hear exactly what happened, but a lot of the times it's really up to -- golf is a game of honor. I know nothing about what happened, but golf is such a game of honor, and you just hope that people uphold the honor of the game. That's all I can say.

Q. (Inaudible.)

CRISTIE KERR: Yes, that's the whole thing.

Q. Can you get comfortable out there?

CRISTIE KERR: Yes, you can. It comes down to one player's word over another. You got to believe the honor of the game, you know, especially if you have people watching. It's not like she would intentionally try to take an illegal drop. And, again, I think, if she is going to do that, it's on her conscience. I think only she really knows what happened.

Paula apparently got a very good line on where the ball flew in and it never carried the line of the margin of the hazard. She would have to retee. I saw it on TV last night briefly. It looked like a straight block. So again, it's up to interpretation.

Q. (Inaudible).

CRISTIE KERR: Yes, it didn't look like a slice. My whole thing, you know, uphold the honor of the game, be honest. If you hit a crappy shot, you got to go back to the tee. It's unfortunate what you have to do.

Q. It's a feisty move for a rookie. They said you had brass kahunas?

CRISTIE KERR: If Paula thinks she is right and she has evidence to think she is right. When you are playing in a 2-some, it's really easy to follow the ball of somebody else. So Paula had good reason to make her think about it. Yes, you got to stand up for what you got to believe in, too.

You know, I think the thing on 16, there is not a lot of ball marks on these greens. If there is a scuff mark, again, it's up to interpretation. It just depends.

Q. Do you want it that much more?

CRISTIE KERR: Yes, I do, I want another shot at it, you know.

Q. (Inaudible)?

CRISTIE KERR: Absolutely I did. I want to keep getting better. I'm finding ways for my game to get better. Today was a big day for me.

Q. (Inaudible)?

CRISTIE KERR: Sure, but four days on this golf course is a long week. You got to take it day by day.

Q. What did you do there?

CRISTIE KERR: Birdied it. Hit it 15 feet under the hole.

Q. What clubs did you hit today other than you hit yesterday?

CRISTIE KERR: The course played very similar. Instead of the north, northeast wind, it might have been more from the east. The course didn't play any shorter plus it was wet. We had a lot of mud on the ball and weren't getting a roll on the tee shots. So it played equally as long.

Q. What did you hit there again?

CRISTIE KERR: An 8-iron.

Q. Is that about 160?

CRISTIE KERR: I think I had 163 to the hole and it was playing 155 or something. I didn't even really hit it solid and it got 15 feet from the hole. I'm glad I didn't hit a 7-iron.

Q. Would it have ricocheted off the rock pile?

CRISTIE KERR: Yes.
