AN INTERVIEW WITH CHAD CAMPBELL

DAVE LANCER: We have Chad Campbell with us, we appreciate you coming in after the one-hole playoff today.

Can you just go through the one hole that you played today, I guess, if you want to give us a little detail.

CHAD CAMPBELL: I hit a good tee shot. I was right down the middle, a perfect 5-wood in for my second shot and just hit it a little right. You definitely don't want to miss that green left. I guess I was guarding against that a little bit, hit a good chip. The putt was just outside the left edge and just hit it a little bit too firm.

Q. How weird is this, this isn't the normal way to win or lose?

CHAD CAMPBELL: No, not at all. It was pretty weird just me and Adam out on the range in the pouring rain hitting balls, that was pretty interesting. But there is nothing you can do about it. And, you know, just kind of at the mercy of the weather this week.

Q. Are you at any kind of disadvantage having not playing in two days?

CHAD CAMPBELL: I don't know. Maybe so. I wasn't able to hit many shots. I felt good out there. I was hitting the ball fine on the range. I don't really think it was a real disadvantage.

Q. Could you run through this morning, you get here at what time and when you find out there is going to be a one-hole playoff?

CHAD CAMPBELL: I got here just before 7:30 and they were making an announcement at 7:30.

Q. You had hoped to play the hole round, did you say on no?

CHAD CAMPBELL: Well, obviously you hope to play 54. But kind of after, you know, I was eating dinner got home about 9 o'clock, it was pouring rain last night and woke up this morning and it was still pouring, so you kind of know. The course can't take this much rain. No course can.

Q. Can you run through the drop, it didn't look like you got much of a break from where you ball is?

CHAD CAMPBELL: The drop was fine actually, the ground was a little wet underneath, but there was no casual water. So that was really the only place I had to go with it. I was happy with the chip that I hit. It was four feet.

Q. Chad, what was your yardage into the green?

CHAD CAMPBELL: 213 to the hole.

Q. And is that normally a 5-wood for you?

CHAD CAMPBELL: No, no that is probably a 3-iron.

Q. And that was more, because of the rain?

CHAD CAMPBELL: Well, just cold and rain, you know, wind a little bit into us, stuff like that.

Q. When it's all said and done, and you look back on this week and figure, gee, I finished second and made a lot of money, or do you just turn the page, I want to forget it?

CHAD CAMPBELL: Definitely disappointed. You would like to win. But interesting circumstances this week. I'm going to take positives out of this week. I played well the first two days. I would have like had to have continued the tournament. I think everybody would have at least liked to get 54 holes in, but it's just not possible. I feel like I'm starting to play a lot better. So just take positives out of it going into next week.

Q. If you had won, does this really feel like a victory, it's not official?

CHAD CAMPBELL: Yes, it's kind of. There is a winner. But, yes, I know what you mean. But you never want to get beat in a playoff. That's never a good feeling.

Q. Do you feel less disappointed because it was not really an official thing? Are you any less disappointed? If you had lost this in a playoff on Sunday would you be more disappointed?

CHAD CAMPBELL: I don't think so really. I think it's pretty equal. You know, I don't like losing.
