Second-round Interviews

Interview of Dawn Coe-Jones

THE MODERATOR: Dawn, thanks for coming in. Fantastic round today. 67 yesterday, 66, and 9-under for the tournament. This is a great spot to be in. Talk about your round.

DAWN COE-JONES: Well sure, Paul. I haven't played great all year. I've just been kind of plodding along, and struggled the last month or so. And to be 9-under for the last two days. I'm thrilled. I changed putters on Wednesday, and I'm seeing the ball go in the hole, and that's pretty much the difference out here. You know, a lot of players can hit the ball really well. And, you know, you can watch on TV and the person that can putt is usually the one that is winning the golf tournament.

MODERATOR: What kind of a difference do you think the change in the putter made?

DAWN COE-JONES: Sometimes it's a new look. You know, my husband told me to go to all of the guys out there and look at all of the putters that you can look at, and find one that looks good and feels good in your hand. And I got a Two Ball that I really like, the weight feels good, and seeing the line.

DAWN COE-JONES: The golf course is in really, really good shape. The greens are still holding. You know, and it's starting to run out. I played Monday morning at 7:30 and the golf course played long. And it's drying out, and hence, you are getting a lot more roll on the fairways. They have good pins, it's a matter of getting yourself on the correct side of the hole to be able to be aggressive and take a run at birdies.

Q At this stage in your career you've accomplished so many things do you still get nervous or butterflies being 9-under in contention?

DAWN COE-JONES: Yeah. It's not like I'm there every week. You know, but it was just fun to be able to play a round of golf and not worrying about making the cut. That's a pretty sad thing to think about, but sometimes you get to that point. And I have been battling tendonitis. And often times your mind is not as sharp as it needs to be to pull you through when things aren't going well. Especially this being the last week play hard, play well. Because I know I'm not going to be playing or cashing any checks for the next four months. Or you can pack it in and say, you know, it was a bad year. And, you know, I wanted to finish on a good note. Regardless of what happens this weekend, I am go to go out there and do my best. It was fun to play good golf, and that is something I can carry into next year. I'm still competitive.

DAWN COE-JONES: I haven't been in that position, you know, in a long, long time. But you know, like I said, I'm a streaky putter and if I can keep rolling the ball well and don't get in my own way, you know, who knows come Sunday.
