AN INTERVIEW WITH EUN-HEE JI

MIKE SCANLAN: Eun-Hee, thank you so much for coming in. You played great today. If you would just talk about your day and being just a few strokes back entering Sunday.

THE INTERPRETER: Today you could see that Paula didn't have her best day, but at the same time I wasn't really having my A game as well. I'm kind of happy I am where I am. My putter wasn't working all that well today. But overall I'm okay with where I am.

MIKE SCANLAN: Questions?

Q. A tough shot on 15, off the fringe and miss hit it a little bit and lost the stroke, can you ask her about that?

THE INTERPRETER: The wind was blowing pretty hard from the back tailwind, so I used a different club than I would normally use and I anticipated it to be difficult and sure enough it just become one. That's about it.

Q. Ask her about putts on 16 and 18, and if that's what she is talking about when she says her putter wasn't working very well. Those were two holes she could have done some damage with.

THE INTERPRETER: To speak overall of the day, I misread the line a few times and went a little aggressive on a couple of putts and I missed it not by much, by a little, but I'm okay with where I am once again. Hopefully I can keep up and tomorrow do better.

Q. Can you go over the bogey on 1?

THE INTERPRETER: The fairway was really wet and I should have gone with a different club. I am not very satisfied with my club selection on hole No. 1. The downhill putt was a little bit difficult as well. I just didn't have a good hole there, as simple as that.

Q. Is there any particular spots on the course where she feels she can put up some birdies tomorrow? Make Paula really work for it.

THE INTERPRETER: I should say 17 and 18th first and foremost. But I haven't been playing very well on the front 9 and I feel more comfortable and more confident on the back 9. I think that's where I can make Paula work a little more.

Q. Do you need Paula to help you out by not playing very well?

THE INTERPRETER: Well, I mean I can't say I want Paula to make all of the mistakes, I would not say that. I just want to play to my best and hope Paula has a great round tomorrow, and I feel like we are going to have a great day. Have a competitive round tomorrow.

Q. You hit every fairway today, you only missed three the whole tournament, you are leading the field, how crucial has finding that fairway be to your success this week.

THE INTERPRETER: My game, the strong part of my game is the accuracy. I don't hit it very far. So I need to do well on what my strength is and that's to be able to hit the ball with the great accuracy.

Q. 14? What went wrong there?

THE INTERPRETER: She thinks she talked about it. 168, 6-iron to the left side.

Q. The little chip?

THE INTERPRETER: That's the one she talked about earlier, she thought it was 15, but it was 14. She hit it to the left.

Q. I was talking about the chip.

THE INTERPRETER: I misread the line on the grass and it was a little too short.

Q. Misread the grain of the grass?

THE INTERPRETER: Yes, misread the grain of the grass. Yes.
