Final-round tournament quotes:

AN INTERVIEW WITH LUCAS GLOVER

(Interview by tape.)

Q. Can you tell us how it went today, besides pretty good?

LUCAS GLOVER: Yes, it was good. I hit it like I hit it on Thursday, I just made a few more puts. I made a lot of 12 and 15-footers that I hadn't been making last week and this week. I had a nice putting lesson with myself in the room last night, so that kind of paid off today.

Q. (Inaudible)?

LUCAS GLOVER: No, no, putting to win, it's like putting at home. They all go in when there is no holes. That might have been the best thing.

Q. In your hotel room?

LUCAS GLOVER: Yes, just in the room. Hanging out, wasting time. I couldn't stand up on the putting green. So I just took the putter and a ball home, and worked on a few things in the mirror and it kind of paid off.

Q. Literally?

LUCAS GLOVER: Yes, exactly.

Q. (Inaudible)?

LUCAS GLOVER: It was at the Lowes.

Q. What was the difference today with the wind?

LUCAS GLOVER: The scoreboard tells it all. I don't know if that will be the low of the day. Just playing like I did Thursday. Nothing against the course. It's in such good shape, and the greens are obviously a lot better than they were. Now, they look tough because of the weather, and the storms and everything they had, but they are rolling fine. The scores are going to be low when you have that, a lot of wedges, the par-5s are all reachable.

Q. Can you tell us your thoughts up there)?

LUCAS GLOVER: I was just trying to get it in the hole. I put the steering wheel on, starting on No. 5. I couldn't let my mind go anymore. I wish I would have. I got a little tentative. I felt like I needed that one on 9 for some other stuff, but misread it a little bit. I didn't think it was a bad putt, but just misread it a little bit.

I feel like I probably should have birdied 6 and 9, but I didn't, and 63 on Sunday is not nothing to complain about.

Q. Why did you put your steering wheel on?

LUCAS GLOVER: I don't know. I just started looking at the board and saying alright, I got to keep going, keep going, and then made that putt on 4, and I don't know, it wasn't swinging the right way anymore, I guess.

Q. What were you thinking about the 16th hole?

LUCAS GLOVER: No, no, one hole at a time and try to do it. But the camera showed up and I kind of locked up a little bit. But, you know, that's golf. Hopefully, I can be that low again and have another opportunity to act differently, I guess would be the right thing to say.

Q. Was it fun target practice today?

LUCAS GLOVER: There was some you had to be careful on. The greens, you know, you get in the wrong spot, but for the most part. With no wind, you got control over your ball. You got a lot of short irons and lot of wedges, and like I said, the par-5s are pretty reachable. They're set up for low scores and the greens get soft, the rain and everything we've had kind of helps that.

Q. Have you liked the way it's gone this year? You haven't even won yet but you look at your record and it's a steady diet of Top-10's?

LUCAS GLOVER: Right. Yes, I have been very pleased. I've been very pleased. I've been in the mix a few times starting Sunday. I've been pleased. Obviously, the goal every week is to win, but nobody does that.
