INTERVIEW OF JASON BOHN

JOEL SCHUCHMANN: Jason Bohn, thanks for joining us here after your second round at the Crowne Plaza Invitational at Colonial. Rounds of 63, 65 to open up the first 36 holes, maybe some opening comments.

A great couple of days for you and a nice finish for you with a birdie on the 9th.

**JASON BOHN:** Yes, thanks, played well again today. I kind of got off to a slow start though. I was a little shaky early. I hit a couple of wayward shots, managed to scramble and get up and down for some pars, and then I started to hit some good golf shots starting on about my 7th hole and then I played, I had a nice front 9.

JOEL SCHUCHMANN: You shot 63 yesterday and obviously the conditions are still somewhat benign being a little bit soft and not a lot of wind, but how hard is it to follow up a good round like a 63?

**JASON BOHN:** Yes, it was out there again today for sure. I mean, you could have shot 7 or 8-under par. I played with Kenny Perry. I don't know what he thought, maybe 64, 63 also. He had some opportunities so he could have shot a little lower than that. It was definitely out there for a take. With no wind, the greens have to be a little bit softer, or they are going to die in this heat. It's very accessible for sure.

JOEL SCHUCHMANN: Questions?

Q. Jason, you just made an interesting point that you thought Kenny was playing well but you're not sure what he shot. So it bodes the question, do you feed off of other guys that you are playing with when they're playing well, or are you so focused that you don't even see it?

**JASON BOHN:** No, absolutely, there is lot of feeding that goes along with guys who are playing well in your group and vice versa. You can kind of get it going the opposite way if your playing partners aren't playing so well. But you see a lot of high quality shots. It builds confidence within yourself whether you are hitting them or not. You see that the flags are accessible, you are kind of watching shots land close to the hole.

Kenny, I thought, putted very well today. He had a couple of putts that rolled right over the edge of the hole. When you see good putts being hit, the momentum, the karma, whatever, it's all good. So I think when guys talk about being able to feed off of other guys in the group that's what they are referring to.

Q. Can you tell us how the ear is today and what, if anything, you did overnight to make it better?

**JASON BOHN:** You know, I didn't do anything overnight other than stay on my antibiotics and some of my antihistamines I'm taking to dry it up. I slept better last night which was good. I didn't have a lot of pain.

Actually today my equilibrium actually got worse. I noticed going up and down, standing up and down that I got dizzy a few times. I don't know whether it was my ear or the heat or a combination of the both. I kind of had to slow it down a little bit out there. I was really cautious. I actually had to stand over my putts probably a second or two seconds longer than I normally would to feel that I was settled before I hit my putts. I still can't hear anything out of my left ear. I'm hoping it's getting better. So no pain so that's a good thing.

Q. From your perspective, tell us the best things that were happening today, and some of the things other than the challenge with the ear, any battles, anything you were struggling with out there today?

**JASON BOHN:** You know, today I'm putting very well. I putted very well yesterday, and I made a lot of nice putts today. I didn't drive my golf ball that great today, not as well as I did yesterday for sure. So I wasn't able to attack as many flags. I kind of had to shoot away from some flag sticks.

The biggest struggle of the day in all honesty is the heat. No question. My last four or five holes I was really feeling it. I don't know if it's because I was under the weather. I was losing some focus pretty quick coming in the stretch. It's tough. You are hot, your trying stay hydrated, you're trying to eat, you're trying to do everything you possibly can, but you don't feel like eating anything in this heat.

There is no wind so far this year at Colonial, but the heat is definitely taken a toll for sure.

Q. Talk about how you feel with the position going into the weekend round. What do you think you are going to need to do to climb where you want to be on Sunday?

**JASON BOHN:** I feel great going into Sunday. I think anybody who is within six or seven shots of the lead is in this golf tournament. There is no question due to the fact that there are low opportunities out there. I don't know what the weather forecast is supposed to be like for tomorrow. Probably like today I would imagine. So it's going to be low scoring. You're going to have to play aggressive, and you're going to have to make a lot of birdies. There is no way that the guys at the top of the leaderboard are going to go backwards. They are going to keep going forward. You got to put your foot down and just keep pressing and play aggressively for sure.

Q. Do you consider yourself a player that has like a discipline game plan going into a competition and now the success you're experiencing does that game plan change? And if so, how?

**JASON BOHN:** I feel like I'm a player who has to have a very dedicated game plan. I don't overpower golf courses, so I have to stick to my game plan and position my golf ball. And this is a golf course that suits that. When you are striking the golf ball well, you can play this golf course from position. You don't have to hit it very far, you just have to hit it in play. I definitely will stick to my game plan. Since I won a month ago, I kind of have some confidence. I've got the luxury to fire at flag sticks. I don't know, I'm going to play as aggressively, as intelligently aggressively as I possibly can. I will put it to you that way. We are going to fire at flag sticks for sure. We are going to try to make birdies. We know we have to.

JOEL SCHUCHMANN: Speaking of your win at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans, after that did you reassess your goals of what other things you would like to accomplish this year?

**JASON BOHN:** I set two major goals for me at the beginning of the year. One was to win. And the other one is to play in my home town of Atlanta in THE TOUR Championship. I've got a full schedule the rest of the summer, I'm going to play a lot of golf and I'm going to play really hard to try to position myself to go in the FedExCup and try to get in the TOUR Championship. That tournament I've never been able to play in my career and something I really want to accomplish.

Q. Jason, does the Ryder Cup come into play for you at all?

**JASON BOHN:** You know, for me, I've got to be inside the Top-8. That's the only thing. I'm going to play as hard as I can. I would love to play a Ryder Cup obviously. I don't know if there is an American who wouldn't love to play for his country. That's one of those things you just kind of play along, and if you play your way in, you pat yourself on the back.

But, yes, if I'm 9th on the point list, I don't expect to here a call from Corey Pavin by any means and rightfully so. Yes, but that's something in the back of every's guys mind for sure.
