**Final-round Interviews**

**AN INTERVIEW WITH JASON DAY**

Q. Jason, a tough experience out there today?

**JASON DAY:** It was a good experience for me. I'm a bit disappointed that I couldn't finish. I look back on it now, and I know what I've done through the round. If I ever get in that position again, I'm going to try my hardest not to do the same exact as I did today.

I'm a little bit disappointed, but I'm happy that I stuck with it and I finished fourth.

Q. How were your nerves, your thinking process and your ability to kind of work yourself through this final round pressure?

**JASON DAY:** You know, just a little bit nerves there. But I guess when you get to a certain point in the game, you kind of put that aside, and I just tried to work on it and stayed patient. I got ahead of myself a little bit too much, paid the price. I didn't hit many greens today. If you can't hit the greens, you can't make those putts. I missed too many greens and I got a learning experience.

Q. It's a learning experience that you can be proud of, sir?

**JASON DAY:** Thank you very much.

Q. Obviously, you started off on the first hole, sand to sand?

**JASON DAY:** That was an unlucky break. I had the wrong club. After I hit the shot, I knew I had the wrong club, and I pulled it left a little bit. I was pretty unlucky to hit it where it was, to hit it in the bunker and travel it up to the sticks.

Q. Nothing got going for you, you had some chances?

**JASON DAY:** I didn't hit -- I hit a few fairways today, not as many as I would like to. I didn't hit the greens. I didn't put myself in the position that I needed to like the last three days I did. You can't do that out here. You do that out here, and

you are behind the 8-ball straightaway. I just didn't have enough chances at birdie putts today.

Q. I am looking at 18, did you drive it to 10 on purpose, I know that's a bigger landing area, you know what I mean?

**JASON DAY:** No, actually I was trying to hit it down the right, and I hit a draw, and I just came over the top of it and hit a full hook, and I got lucky and actually hit a tree and it actually went out to the left and had a pretty close shot. I just wanted to make sure that I gave myself a birdie putt. If I could get to 17-under, who knows what's going to happen down the last. I just missed on that left edge.

Q. I saw you looking at the scoreboards a lot, do you think it played some mind games with you on the front 9. I know you bogeyed 5 after you looked at it.

**JASON DAY:** I didn't really notice. I try looking at scoreboards as much as I can. I just like to know where I'm at in the field and what I need to do. I've always been that way. It wasn't much of a change there.

Q. Do you think this tournament kind of putts you on the map in Fort Worth, maybe people didn't know you were here?

**JASON DAY:** They know I live here now, a lot more people know that. I'm a local now. I'm proud of it. It's pretty much better that way.

Q. A pretty solid tournament?

**JASON DAY:** You know, the last tournament I played I missed the cut. I worked hard for this week. And I have been working hard all year. Hopefully I can come through with a win sooner or later.

Q. One final question, looking at the Money List, do you think it's a tournament that might get you your card next year when the season ends?

**JASON DAY:** You know, this will be a big chunk of it, yes, it will. Obviously I have to thank Peter and his team for giving me a spot in the field this week. I'm very appreciative of it.

Q. Did the course play tougher or is it just Sunday?

**JASON DAY:** Yesterday and today the pins were a little bit tighter to the edges. You really had to golf your ball out there. Stricker really managed his game well today. He missed a couple of putts. It was just the pin position and everything is tough on Sunday normally.
