AN INTERVIEW WITH SEOL-AN JEON

Q. We will go ahead and get started. A 7-hole playoff?

SEOL-AN JEON: Was it? I didn't realize that.

Q. A long day today, but you played very well?

SEOL-AN JEON: Yes, I did.

Q. And you're the runner-up finish. Do you want to tell us about the day?

SEOL-AN JEON: Well, first of all, I didn't expect it at all. I missed some putts, and she missed some putts and we were tied and now at that time, I realized maybe I can do something today. And the last hole, she missed the short one. And my caddy told me now playoff.

At that time I was okay I finished second. And he told me now playoff. Wow. I mean I had a lot of fun out there. I learned a lot from Cristie. She is a good player, you know. I saw her every time on TV, and I played with her, that's the really exciting thing. So I'm happy.

Q. The shot that you hit on the last hole, the chip where it hit the branch, did you account for that?

SEOL-AN JEON: No, I mean I was trying to hit it a little lower, but I need to close -- at that time, I needed to close a little more face. It was a mistake, a miss shot.

Q. You hit a 7-wood in, is that correct?

SEOL-AN JEON: No, a 5-wood. I don't have a 7-wood. My 3-iron, I know I couldn't get over the bunker, so I was trying to choke down with my 5-wood and hit it a little smooth. But it was hard to judge the wind. It just happened.

Q. Is this like anything you been through before, or is this --

SEOL-AN JEON: Yes, I'm lucky I just played a full tournament here.

Q. Since you have been playing golf at all, have you been through anything like this, the emotions up and down?

SEOL-AN JEON: Not really, no. Yes, this is my first time. I played the Future's Tour two years. I played a lot of times in the final group, but this is the first time.

Q. What was the emotion like for you, you had a couple of putts that were very close in the playoffs?

SEOL-AN JEON: Playoff, yes. This is a playoff, I'm already second. So I was trying to, like, trying to make everything like No. 17, my chip shot I kind of bombed. But I tried to make every shot. (Inaudible), but it didn't work.

Q. Were you at all surprised when Cristie missed that short putt on 18 to force the playoff?

A. Yes, I was really, really surprised.

Q. Really surprised?

SEOL-AN JEON: Yes.

Q. (In Korean.)

SEOL-AN JEON: I think that the wind, I don't think this course is really difficult like last week, but wind. I mean, I'm not really -- I'm a rookie, I don't have any experience with this wind.

Q. The question was it about the wind, about the conditions?

SEOL-AN JEON: He asked about the wind.

Q. The most difficult time?

SEOL-AN JEON: It was wind. I would have to judge wind every time. Most of the holes were into the wind, were downwind, left right, or right-to-left.

Q. Can you remember your birdies and your bogeys? We will figure it out later.

SEOL-AN JEON: Okay.

Q. Can I ask one other question? The putt on 18 where you thought maybe you made it to win, do you remember that, did you feel like you hit a putt that would go in?

SEOL-AN JEON: Yes, today during the playoff I hit a lot of good putts. And every time I made it. But every time I missed it. Which was really -- I had a good putt, I thought I made it.
