AN INTERVIEW WITH KARRIE WEBB

Q. Just talk about getting in and playing for a million dollars?

KARRIE WEBB: Yes, well I'm relieved. It was bit of an up and down day. Obviously I made enough birdies to squeak in there and play the last hole with a little bit of ease.

Q. Talk about tomorrow, what is your game plan going to be Sunday?

KARRIE WEBB: Well, that you are tied for the lead going into the last round of the tournament really. Not normally I'm with seven other people. But you are tied for the lead and it depends what the conditions are going to be like tomorrow. But, you know, you still got to shoot a good score and, obviously, those last few holes are going to come into play a little bit. The last couple of days, especially today on 15, usually I would have gone for it. But today I just laid up, not taking any chances. And depending where I am tomorrow that could be a situation where you might decide to go for it if you are a couple of shots behind or something like that.

Q. Are you going to watch the leaderboards all day?

KARRIE WEBB: I do any way. It's not going to be any different for me.

Q. Put some perspective on this: It's not like a Major championship, or regular, what does winning mean? Where does it fit into what winning means?

KARRIE WEBB: Well, I think it's a big moment for the LPGA when someone can win a million dollars. It goes above winning a tournament because of the monetary value placed on it.
