**AN INTERVIEW WITH CHRISTINA KIM**

THE MODERATOR: Scorecard  
(Scorecard.)

CHRISTINA KIM: You know, the pins were in much more difficult places than they were yesterday. I think yesterday they were sort of (inaudible) where they put flag. But, you know, it's not an easy course. I don't know what golf course Heather was playing. But it wasn't a very easy course, I don't think today, because of where the pins were. And being the last group out there, we had five inches of rain within the last 48 hours, which means a lot of precipitation, which means the greens are really soft. There was a little upturn grass on the greens. But if you are not hitting the ball, you know, right where you want to hit it, you're not going to be able to score as well, especially out on a course like this.

CHRISTINA KIM: You know, it's hard to say because normally whenever it's lift, clean and place, I don't play well, because you are (making noise.) I don't think you have quite as much focus with your drives. You know, your drives really set you up for the entire hole. But, you know, I mean there were a couple of instances, I think, I was in two divots today. But overall, I try not to think about lift, clean and place because it sort of whacks my brain a little bit.

Q. (Inaudible)?

CHRISTINA KIM: Oh, God, I've behaved, stop it. I don't know use bad language nearly as much anymore. Instead I use like animal sounds, or I make up words and things like that. No, I'm not as course, or crass or uncouth as I used to be. I've matured a little bit, I would like to think.

CHRISTINA KIM: I think it's probably going to be soggier tomorrow than it's been. The rain, when the rain comes down as hard as it does, it seems as though the ground doesn't actually absorb it.
