INTERVIEW OF LEE JANZEN

(Interview by tape.)

Q. (Inaudible)?

LEE JANZEN: I guess I was fortunate that my scorekeeper gave me a green on 14 because I was on the fringe. Now that I think about it I guess I didn't miss any greens. I guess I was just really into one shot at a time.

Q. And you combined that with 29 bucks and you get 7-under par.

LEE JANZEN: Yes, I started very well. I hit it in the green-side bunker on 1 and blasted inside three feet and holed my bunker shot on 2, so I was 3-under after two holes. So 4-under the last 16 with a couple of close putts and a couple of bombs.

I was on the green a lot. I felt like I could have puttied better and, you know, I was thinking about 59. You can't help to think about that when I got to 5-under after 7, and I had plenty of opportunities, and I felt like I didn't lose any shots out there, because I was thinking the 59, I was just trying to execute one shot at a time.

It's kind of amazing how golf is that you cannot be as sharp as you want to be but still shoot a good score, and other days where you feel like you are doing everything absolutely perfect as you can and then shoot 70.

Q. That's why it's such a great game and can be so frustrating. (Inaudible) for you to say 59 and Colonial in the same sentence.

LEE JANZEN: Yes, I had a 61 here, it's a long time ago. It was a lifetime ago, and I parred both par-5s. I've known for quite a while that it's doable. And right now, as hot as it is, the greens are holding and with relatively no wind all you really have to know is how far you are. And if you are hitting the ball the distance you think you're hitting it consistently you are going to be pretty

close to the hole, and the greens spot well too, so there is an opportunity to shoot a very low score. I just heard K.J. Choi was 8-under, I think, going to 14 or 15, so he's got a shot at it.
