AN INTERVIEW WITH LORENA OCHOA

(Interview by tape.)

Q. (Inaudible)?

LORENA OCHOA: Well, I had a big one. I knew we had three holes left and after missing that birdie on 15, the par-5 I was pretty upset. I just told myself, you know, keep. There is still three birdies chances, and I am going to try hard to do them and that was a really good feeling, that birdie. It really takes care of things. Hopefully, it's good enough if we go to a playoff and we'll make it.

Q. What was the ruling over situation, what was called for a ruling over there in the rough?

LORENA OCHOA: I was with my right foot just on the edge of the sprinkler. The lie was kind of so-so and I wasn't sure if it was okay to hit that club.

Q. What did you hit, what club?

LORENA OCHOA: An 8-iron, 26 yards into the wind.

Q. Did you feel like you had to par the last two holes? Did you have any good idea whether or not you were going to be in the Top-16 at that point?

LORENA OCHOA: Well, after 15 holes, when you are at even par, not 100% sure. It could close. I try to play safe on the last one to be safe. I try really hard. I was 5-over at that point, and I came back, and I was 1-over, and I'm hoping to have a chance to keep playing on the weekend.

Q. Were you dealing with more pressure than you are used to on Friday then?

LORENA OCHOA: I think so, yes. I felt a lot of pressure playing the last three holes. It's just a fun tournament. I'm enjoying it and hopefully all day fun.

Q. What are your thoughts, what are you thinking when you are 5-over, and you have a lot of ground to make up, it's a tough course?

LORENA OCHOA: It's okay, I'm going to do it. We knew there was some easy plays on the back 9, and I just try to really give myself birdie chances. After I got two or three

lip-outs, it's hard, it hurts twice than a normal Friday.

Q. How long was the putt on 16 that you missed?

LORENA ÓCHOA: 10 feet.

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
