AN INTERVIEW WITH MICHELE REDMAN

PAUL ROVNAK: Michele, thanks for coming in and speaking with us. Great day today; four birdies, no bogeys, and finished up tied for second. Just talk about your day if you would.

MICHELE REDMAN: Well, I hit it great today. I really probably couldn't hit the ball any better. I missed my drive on 18. I really hit some good golf shots. If I made my putt on the front 9, I think I would have been right in with Annika for sure. I really hit it good today.

PAUL ROVNAK: We'll take questions, and please go ahead and use the microphone.

Q. At what point did you start to think about winning and making Annika notice that somebody is coming?

MICHELE REDMAN: Probably when I birdied 16. You know, I was just trying to stay in my own game out there. I didn't look at the board. I had no idea where I was. You know, I knew I was kind of in it, but I knew that this course is so demanding that you can't really take your focus off the golf course. You really got to think about what you're doing. One hole can take you right out of the tournament here.

Q. Could you just comment on Annika winning a 10th time on the LPGA TOUR, what do you think of that?

MICHELE REDMAN: She is a great player. She is a great ball striker. You know, you have to be a good ball striker to win this event. It's a tough golf course. It's been touchy conditions. She is just a great player.

Q. The highest winning score of this tournament, here or somewhere else, what do you see? This is the highest winning score of this tournament.

MICHELE REDMAN: I think the weather had a ton to do with it. The course played a lot longer, so you weren't getting run on the ball, so you had to hit longer clubs, and just the wind. It's definitely weather.

Q. Can you go through what you did on 18, what you were thinking, where your shots went?

MICHELE REDMAN: You know, I hadn't missed a fairway all day. You know what, just something with that hole. I just can't get myself to hit that driver out far enough right. Seems I hit into the bunker. I knew I was going to lay it up. I wasn't going to take any chances basically, and I parred that hole lane up two days before that.

So I just said to my caddy, there is more than one way to skin a cat, and I laid it up -- I think I had 92 yards to the pin, and I just hit a nice little wedge there, and I got a 4 there. That's not an easy hole for me, with

the pin on right side. I would say if I have anything to work on it would be the pin placement from the right side is the hardest pin placement for me.

Q. How long was the par putt?

MICHELE REDMAN: On 18, about 2 feet.

Q. Was there a feeling that Annika was catchable today when you came in?

MICHELE REDMAN: You know, I'm not sure because I really didn't look at the board. Like I said, this course is so demanding you got to keep your attention on your own game. Anything can happen on this golf course, and that's why I think it makes it one of the best golf courses that we play.

Q. Did you have a good birdie run on 17 there?

MICHELE REDMAN: I did. You know, I probably could have hit one more club there, but I think that was probably being a little bit more aggressive than I would have liked. You know, I hit it up there to about 4 feet short. It's uphill and into the green. It's hard to get yourself to hit it hard enough up there. I hit it in pretty much where I wanted.

Q. What was the low round today?

MICHELE REDMAN: 68 would have tied Michele and Soo-Yun Kang.

Q. Next year what do you think of the format, if everyone was even around it today?

MICHELE REDMAN: It's going to be interesting. Like I said a couple of days ago, it's the first time we've done it. I think it's a great idea. I think we all just kind of have to see how it plays out. I think for the fans out here, it's going to be great. It's different, and I think that's what they are looking for.

Q. In a way, are you kind of wishing it would go into effect today?

MICHELLE REDMAN: I didn't know that I was tied for the low round, but sure.
