**AN INTERVIEW WITH JOANNE MORLEY**

THE MODERATOR: Joanne, thanks for coming and talking to us.

JOANNE MORLEY: No problem.

THE MODERATOR: You are at 5-under overall. That's a great score for two days on this course. Everybody is saying it is playing pretty difficult. So just your thought of the day, the first two days, with round to go.

JOANNE MORLEY: Actually, I scored better today. I actually hit the ball probably a little bit better yesterday, especially my irons. I wasn't so hot with my irons today, but they were good enough to actually find the green, and I got them pin-high. I just holed some putts over the last two days and that's really been the difference. The course is still playing tough. It's long out there, and you can't miss the fairways basically in a nutshell, you know, it's just the case of trying to knock it down and trying to get up and down.

Q. Was there a difference playing this morning as opposed to yesterday afternoon, difference in the course?

JOANNE MORLEY: I wouldn't say so, no, I think it place pretty much the same. I suppose the only thing with the greens probably rolled a little bit smoother this morning. It kind of got a little, not bumpy in the afternoon yesterday, but you can kind of see where people had been.

But overall the course played, you know, very similar to yesterday.

Q. Weren't you at 3-under?

JOANNE MORLEY: Yes, I was, I finished bogey, bogey.

Q. Did you take that out of your mind, Saturday is a new day?

JOANNE MORLEY: Oh, yes, definitely. 17 is a tricky hole. We actually just took the wrong club off the tee yesterday afternoon. That was a big mistake because we went straight through throughout the fairway. We couldn't do anything from there. We just had to chip back on and hoped to get up and down from the fairway.

And then 18 yesterday afternoon, I missed the sand, I was in the thick stuff by about that much. Just the case of like I said before, just trying to get something down around the green and trying to get up and down. Yes, I just missed that. They are two good finishing holes, so, you know, it's another day.

Q. Talk about your (Inaudible)?

JOANNE MORLEY: I hit a good drive on 9. I had 110 to the pin, hit wedge. It just came up -- I just came back a little bit toward the hole. Away from the hole, sorry. Then I holed probably about a 15-footer. And then on 10 --

Q. Tough hole yesterday, today it's not yielding many birdies at all today?

JOANNE MORLEY: Well, you stand on the tee, and really you got to take it over the trap on the right but with fade. But then the problem is, once it hits the fairway, the

fairway is actually running away from you. So it makes it really tricky. You have to hit a huge fade. I mean, today, all of my greens I hit fairway woods off the tee. Just kind of took it over to the left, on the side of the trap, and just hope you stay in the fairway. Like I say, you pitch over, it goes over the hill, and the whole fairway just rolls away from you. So, I mean all you can do is just commit to the shot. You know, if you walk up there and if it's in the fairway, great.

Q. You were a little further back than Heather and Stacy, is that where you wanted it, 165 out?

JOANNE MORLEY: I would say in the practice rounds we kind of talked about it, and we ended up -- Obviously, yesterday I made a mistake. Today we just decided if you leave it 165 at the flag and leave it from the spot. You can try to get on the short stuff and just give ourselves a chance. You are definitely hitting driver, if you don't hit a huge fade around the corner, just forget it.

Q. What happened on 17?

JOANNE MORLEY: Well, it was slightly left to right. I didn't commit to it as well as I should have done. Maybe a bit more patient.

Q. What do you think it's in store for the afternoon true believers, can any one of them go out and shoot 4-under?

JOANNE MORLEY: Yes, no question, no question. You got Annika up ther. And Christina is playing well since last week. Yes, they can go out and shoot 4 or 5-under.

Q. Do you like your position?

JOANNE MORLEY: Very much so yes. I'm not complaining.

Q. How has your year been to date?

JOANNE MORLEY: It's been up and down. I've actually hit the ball not too badly. I have just not been making any putts really. Over the last few days, I managed to roll some putts. The greens are great here. You get them on line, and you know if it's going in or not. They are pure.

THE MODERATOR: Can we go over your scorecard? You told us about 9 and 10. But tell us about the birdie on two, the par 3.

JOANNE MORLEY: I hit a 6-iron to about six feet just right of the flag, holed that one.

Q. Then we had the bogey on 11?

JOANNE MORLEY: Yes, I hit a 5-wood off the tee, just pushed it a hair. It was just in the right rough. Punched a 7-iron out. It was a great looking shot, pitched well short of the green, it went over the back of the green and it was kind of in the snarly rough. It came out a big hole. I knocked it about 12 feet passed and missed the putt.

And then 12 I hit a good drive, hit a good 6-iron to five feet. Holed it.

14, par-5, drive 9-wood, lob wedge, probably about 12 feet again and rolled it in.
