INTERVIEW WITH REILLEY RANKIN

Q. Run through your round for us, if you would.

REILLEY RANKIN: I'm just going to do the same thing I've done all week and giving myself opportunities on the course and stick to my game plan and play my own game, and it should be a lot of fun.

Q. Have you learned anything from this golf course, playing it now and over the last couple of days?

REILLEY RANKIN: Yes, it drains very well, and the superintendent and the crew have done a good job of keeping it very playable, and they've done a fabulous job.

Q. What is your toughest hole today?

REILLEY RANKIN: Probably the first hole. I hit the 5-Iron about a foot. Nice to get off to a good start.
