AN INTERVIEW WITH SE RI PAK

DANA GROSS-RHODE: Thank you all for coming in. Obviously, Se Ri, there has been a fantastic history for you here at Highland Meadows Golf Club, and you are now the third woman in LPGA Tournament history to win the same event five times.

How does it feel to win again and also be among the likes of Mickey Wright and Annika Sorenstam?

SE RI PAK: First score winnings are always great. That's always been perfect. You just want to win the tournament. Second thing, one of them make history on my name. I think that's pretty special. Very grateful. Very exciting to have that happen, and '07 is a very, very special year, to be in the Hall of Fame and I won the Owens Corning Classic again. I know the history of third woman to win five times the same event, that's pretty good. Always make it something special.

So I can't be asking more than this week. It's really lovely week for me and always great for me. Perfect for me.

DANA GROSS-RHODE: All right. Do we have questions? We will go over the scorecard later with her caddy.

Q. Not the greatest of starts. You had a couple of bogeys and she pulled even. Can you talk about that, and then she gets the ace, which it's looking like it's her day, but you came right back after that.

Can you talk about that sequence of holes and how you were not off to such a good start but bounced back and took control?

SE RI PAK: Like I said, even today, starting not great, but I'm still solid all day. I feel great about it, my game, about the golf course; but I knew Morgan, she played great yesterday with really difficult

conditions, and I know her game is on fire this year. Probably two days ago, the weather was perfect; the golf course condition is great. So either way, I have to go really, really low, but somehow just expecting a couple of bogeys earlier, and she makes a couple of birdies, which is kind of hitting the other way, turning the other way, and then she got ace on No. 6, which is, I feel like, okay, was good until like 5. That was going to be my way, but something changing totally her way. But as soon as she makes ace, actually woke me right away, too. I knew it, but I don't know who is going to win this event, but I know she is close, or I'm close, and I just don't want to give up at all.

I want to win this event so badly. I play so well last three days, too, and then, you know, she got an ace and I get birdie. That's pretty good, especially the ace; and then after that, I feel really great.

Some reason, my game was a lot more solid and a lot more confidence about it, and I knew it's not going to be easy all day today, but I'm pretty much a fighter.

So, I mean, I just do my best all day long, and like I say, yesterday, I wish after 18 today, take my glove off and hopefully holding my trophy in my hand. That's my goal, basically, but I did.

So that's really, really great. That's really great, because really all day, with Morgan, she is such a great player. She's got some game; she's got a really great short game. Pretty much she kept me up all day, which I was probably much harder to myself today, but after that, I got trophy, which is better. So I feel great about it.

Q. Was the most important shot you made all day the bogeys right after she had the hole-in-one?

SE RI PAK: I think so. I think so. And then I make great chance on No. 7, too. That's only like 4, 5 feet for birdie.

Q. I mean, you were sort of sent a message right away. Great shot.

SE RI PAK: Yes. But I'm still there. But she is just good. She is really good putter. As I say, just after she made ace, which makes me, Hey, you better work really hard; otherwise, the game is over.

I got a great shot a couple of times, and over and over, and makes me think I'm still there. I know at the point, probably the game is turning to my way, hopefully, at the end, which I really focus on every single shot, every single second, up to 18. It's a pretty finish.

Q. Se Ri, can you talk about after winning this tournament five times, is it still exciting for you to be here all the time?

SE RI PAK: Yes, all the time, no matter what. Even if you are winning every year, I'm still very excited about the winning. There is no question about it. I really love to golf here all the time. I just want to be winning all the time, so this is one of my favorites. Yes, definitely.

Q. Can you talk about that shot you made on 18, your third shot?

SE RI PAK: Third shot, I know Morgan has trouble, but you never know. It

can be holding from her distance, you know. You never know, but I know I still have to finish a good way. So only have 85 to the pin, and I got perfect club in my hand, and I'm trying to finish a good way, which is trying to make a birdie. I had a solid shot there, and I didn't mean it to be that close, but the gallery liked it. So it makes me happy.

After all, the walk to the green, I feel like now I can, you know, feel really relaxed because I have a great chance. So just the game of golf, as long as you not give up easily and you are a fighter, it can be all the time you can be great. That's what I love about it.

Q. Do you feel like you were really in a battle out there?

SE RI PAK: I was. All day. All day long. It's not easy day for me today, especially fighting for the winning, and then we only shot for like 2-shot lead, and then I was 1 shot behind and 2 shots behind, which is just really not easy. But she is young, and she has a long way to go. She knew her game pretty well. So basically not easy. She is not a little kid either. So today, all day, for me was really good.

Q. Could you go over the birdie on 15 which gave you the lead for good?

SE RI PAK: 15 hole, got 3-wood. That makes the turning point pretty close my way, I think. I just really had a perfect shot on the tee and second shot was perfect on my right and only about 3 feet for birdie, which was pretty good.

Still we got three holes to go. We have two Par 5s, which you never know. Par 5 is always the chance for birdie. So she can make birdie, I can make birdie, we can make birdie for Par 5.

So I think 15 is one of the key points at the end to turning the winning, I think.

Q. Give or take a couple of dollars, do you know you've won a million dollars in this tournament, as of today?

SE RI PAK: Well, I like to hear about making a million dollars from this city, but I think it's a very special city. I have to talk to my agent about something because I have a great relationship with the city.

That's the accountant there. He can help me out.

Really, I would really love to do that. I think just something, really, because this city is always forgiving me. That's very special city, so I will, part of it.

Q. You've been in the final group out here a lot of times. Have you ever seen more people out there than there were today?

SE RI PAK: Is it today there was lots of people, right? That's the first time I ever see a lot of gallery here. I talked to TJ and talked to someone, and I say, That's the most fans out here I ever see. That's great. Every year I know there's lots of fans out there, but this year is amazing. It makes a difference, yes.

DANA GROSS-RHODE: Any other questions for Se Ri?

Q. Compared to the last three days, the weather here was perfectly calm. Did that help your game at all today, or were you just used to the wind by this point?

SE RI PAK: Today, without the wind, it feels weird. I was just probably just this morning, I talked to one of the Korean players and said, You know, what, something missing here today. Perfect weather, great conditions, great golf course, but what's missing is the wind. It was weird. I don't hear anything like the wind going by my ears. But I know today, even though like today is perfect day, is sometimes more difficult to play well. I mean, I think. Because windy day, bad conditions, you always like focused so hard. Perfect day, you are focusing on it, but not as much, because you know it's going to really be a great day. Today, I mean, I know I'm missing something. I'm still playing as well as I could.
