INTERVIEW WITH ANNIKA SORENSTAM

Q. You closed with a birdie, correct?

ANNIKA SORENSTAM: I did, yes. I'm trying to think, my 16th hole.

Q. About how far was that?

ANNIKA SORENSTAM: About 8 feet.

Q. And when did you find out that 11 was going to be your last hole?

ANNIKA SORENSTAM: Well, I knew they were going to blow it at 8 o'clock. So we just had to play as many holes as possible.

Q. You said earlier you are just taking it one shot at a time, one round at a time. Can you tell us how you feel now, not having completed the course, the round three and just talking about going into tomorrow?

ANNIKA SORENSTAM: Yes, it's going to be another long day. It's been a long week with the weather delays and so forth. So I mean, I'm looking forward to taking a hot shower. I'm hot; I mean a cold shower, get some food, get some rest, and it will be a long day tomorrow.

Q. Because of the schedule this week, do you think the fact that you are a veteran out here helps you deal with the changing schedule day in and day out?

ANNIKA SORENSTAM: I think a lot of players are used to it. We have had a long stretch the last months. There has been a lot of delays and so forth. I think the key is to make sure you drink a lot of water today, get some sleep. It's going to be a long day tomorrow. You physically have to be in shape, I think.

Q. What is your confidence going into tomorrow? Of course you are in a very good spot right now.

ANNIKA SORENSTAM: I got to make some birdies. It seems like the leaders are making birdies. I have to try a little more. Obviously I'm happy to birdie my last and the two holes before that. So I'm going to make some birdies tomorrow. Seems like everybody is, and that's what's going to matter tomorrow.
